

Resurfacing Update

Investing in infrastructure is one of the most significant roles that local governments play. While it's not terribly exciting, resurfacing roads is a key part of this responsibility.

Some background on the process:

- Every two years, the Engineering Department drives and rates all streets within the City and gives each a 1-10 rating based on a national Pavement Surface Evaluation and Rating (PASER) system.
- This, along with our current and projected funding are used to create a city asset management plan.
- In the "off year", the department re-rates all streets that are in the lower scores. They then group the lower rated streets by work area, perform an estimate, and determine the best way to piece together these work areas for a several year program.
- As each area is completed, they can update the plan, and roll into the next group.


The area of Old Town on the map below (roads north of Conner, south of Monument, east of 10th, and west of 19th) is being resurfaced this season.

The project is scheduled to begin in the next few weeks and take approximately twelve weeks to complete, weather permitting.

While street parking will be prohibited during certain phases of the construction, the contractor will post signs in advance to notify local residents of days of no on-street parking. Access will be maintained to

all homes throughout construction, too.
